HUDSON 44, HANOVER-HORTON 8

HANOVER — Who says Hudson doesn't like to pass?

The Tigers pass offense was in high gear Thursday as Hudson beat Hanover-Horton behind the arm of Anthony Arredondo.

Kannon Marry caught an 85-yard touchdown pass from Arredondo. Ambrose Horwath caught a touchdown pass as well.

As a team Hudson rushed 36 times for 260 yards.

Hudson led 44-0 at halftime. In the fourth quarter Hanover-Horton scooped up a fumble and returned it 70 yards for its only score of the game.

ADDISON 44, PINE RIVER 0

It was the best possible start for Addison.

The Panthers' Spencer Brown took the opening kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown to give Addison the quick lead and they would never look back in beating the Bucks.

"We didn't have anything special set up," Addison coach Joshua Lindeman said. "He just took it, got a few blocks and got into he open and he was gone. It got us going and I think deflated them a little bit."

Brown added two rushing touchdowns later. Keelan Mullin had touchdown runs of 5 and 56 yards and starting quarterback Jaxen Sword connected with Gunnar Demuese for a 23-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

Top performers: Brown rushed six times for 104 yards while Mullin added 72 yards on four carries. Sword, who had 31 yards rushing, completed two of his three passes for 48 yards.

Coach Lindeman: "We did some positive things but there are things we have to clean up. I liked how we spread the ball around to our backs. That's the nature of this offense. I don't even know who is getting the ball most times, I just know the plan that I want."

GRASS LAKE 35, SHRINE 6

The Grass Lake Football team traveled up to Royal Oak to take on Royal Oak Shrine in the 2022 season opener Friday.

They returned to Grass Lake with a 35-6 season opening win.

Robert Anderson started opened the scoring in the 1st quarter, hauling in a 22 yard touchdown pass from Brayden Lape.

The second score of the game finally arrived in the 3rd quarter on a 42 yard touchdown run by Andrew Stockton.

Later in the 3rd, Lape hit Jefferey Peterson for a 69 yard strike to put the Warriors up 21-0 going in to the 4th quarter.

In the 4th, Willie Higgins caught a quick pass from Lape and rumbled his way into the endzone for a 15 yard score.

Later in the 4th, a Brayden Lape 6 yard run closed out the scoring for the Warriors.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Warriors played fast and physical. Jack Reid led the team with 8 tackles. Higgins, Odin Robinson, and Jaden McCoy chipped in 4 tackles each. Robinson and Josh Claussen each tallied two Tackles for Loss. Claussen and Higgins also added a sack a piece to the stat sheet. Robert Anderson and Jack Pine picked off two passes in the Warrior secondary.

TECUMSEH 54, MICHIGAN CTR 0

From the start, it didn't look like Michigan Center stood much of a chance against the bigger, faster, stronger Tecumseh squad.

Sometimes looks don't deceive, as Tecumseh routed the Cardinals in the non-league opener Thursday, 54-0.

Tecumseh (1-0) led 22-0 after the first quarter and 42-0 at the half with junior running back AJ Bryan accounting for three of those touchdowns.

The back breakers came with Tecumseh facing third and long inside its' own 15, both times the plays resulted in touchdowns with Bryan scoring on an 85-yard run after senior quarterback Jake Burns found senior receiver Jobe Benschoter for a 79-yard touchdown pass. Burns ran in two touchdowns of his own while Tyler Clement and Jacob Robson scored the two touchdowns in the second half.

Manchester scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns to break a 6-6 and win its opener.

The Flying Dutchmen got a 25-yard TD run by Wyatt Carson with 11:16 left in the game then followed that up with a 9-yard scoring

run by Blake Sloan with under six minutes left.

Manchester's Kannon Duffing threw for 146 yards, including seven completions to Jaxon McGuigan for 105 yards.

The Flying Dutchmen allowed 225 yards by the Whitmore Lake offense but just a second-quarter touchdown.

EAST JACKSON 26, POTTERVILLE 22

Down 14-0 at the half, East Jackson scored 14 points in the third quarter and 12 more in the fourth to rally past Potterville.

Caleb Weaver ran 17 times for 93 yards and two touchdowns.

Austin Tingley was 9-of-21 passing for 216 yards and two touchdowns.

Landon Roberts had four catches for 116 yards and a touchdown. Clayton Clark hauled in a 44-yard touchdown reception.

NAPOLEON 37, COLUMBIA CTL 21

NAPOLEON – Facing a two-score deficit in the first half, the Napoleon Pirates scored 30 unanswered to beat Columbia Central 37-21 on Thursday in the season opener for both.

The Pirates took the lead late in the first half through a combination of big plays on offense and special teams and a big drive from the offense. Napoleon extended that lead in the second half with another big play from the offense and several big plays from the defense.

"Before the game we talked about there's ups and downs," Pirates tight end Trent Jester said. "We knew when we got down we would come back and bring the hammer, so that's what we did."

Napoleon led 22-21 at halftime and nearly saw that lead slip away after fumbling the ball away on its opening drive of the third quarter. Columbia Central's Mason Czubachowski recovered and the Golden Eagles put together a 15-play drive to get to the Pirates' five, a Cody Richardson 11-yard scramble setting up the first-and-goal opportunity.

But on the next play a fumble rolled into the end zone, picked up by Napoleon's Holden Van Poppel to stop Columbia Central's drive.

"We had a heck of a drive to start the third quarter and thought we scored, fumbled at the one apparently and that was a big momentum shift," Columbia Central coach Dylan Zaborowski said. "We just didn't bounce back from it. It just shows we're a little young, a little inexperienced. But I was proud of the guys."

Napoleon followed the turnover with a five-play scoring drive, quarterback Grant Bradley racing 47 yards for a score on a fourth down to make it 28-21.

With a chance to tie early in the fourth

quarter, Columbia Central turned the ball over again as Jester stepped in front of a pass from Richardson.

"I was watching the quarterback the whole time, watching his eyes," Jester said. "I got my read step and I thought they'd been throwing out [routes] the whole game, so I went to the sideline and I picked it."

That led to a 27-yard Cooper Wyers field goal and Bart Laretz capped off the scoring with a three-yard touchdown run with 1:13 left in the game.

Laretz had 28 carries for 159 yards, 104 of which came in the second half.

"Not only the linemen, a lot of us are seniors on the team, but it got emotional," Laretz said. "In the first half I didn't have many. I went into the locker room and teared up a bit, realizing that this is the start of the end. That gave me a bit more motivation to get out there and kick some butt."

Napoleon was able to put together several long drives made up of mostly Laretz runs. A 12-play drive in the first half included eight carries by the senior. The eight-play drive to cap off the scoring saw him run the ball six times.

"We have an amazing offensive line, they move people and they're well-coached," Napoleon coach Derek Shell said. "They know what they're doing, and Bart Laretz embodies what we do. If there's not a hole, he knows to hit the hole and fall forward and get three yards. He embodies what Napoleon football is all about."

Bradley added 73 rushing yards on eight carries and also was 7-of-10 passing for 130 yards.

Richardson was 5-of-14 passing for 40 yards and also rushed 13 times for 119 yards. Of his rushing total, 96 came in Columbia Central's first eight snaps, scoring one touchdown on the first play from scrimmage and getting the Golden Eagles down to the two before his helmet was knocked off and he had to head to the sidelines for one play as Ty Farmer scored.

"He's a really good athlete," Zaborowski said of his quarterback. "When he gets open space he's a really good athlete and makes guys miss. We're going to feed him a lot. In the second half he started cramping a bit, he was feeling a little hurt, so we had to do some different things, but we're expecting him to do a lot."

Big plays marked a wild first half. Richardson took the opening play from scrimmage 70 yards to put the Golden Eagles up 7-0 just 20 seconds into the game.

"I think we came out with a lot of energy," Zaborowski said. "It helps when you bust one on the first play. That's where you can tell we're

still a little young and a little inexperienced.

When we get up on a team, you have to find a way to finish. The first half we played real good football, but two plays killed us and tied it up."

Columbia Central led 21-7 before Napoleon hit on those big plays to end the first half. Starting a drive near midfield with 3:29 left in the second, Bradley rolled to his left then threw downfield to Kayden Fowler for a 54-yard score. A bad snap on the PAT led to Bradley rolling to his right before throwing back to Jester in the end zone for the two-point conversion.

After holding Columbia Central to a three-and-out, Van Poppel put the Pirates in front with a 60-yard punt return up the left sideline, making it 22-21 at halftime.

Columbia Central also got a first-half score from Braden Ellison on a four-yard run in the second quarter, one play after a roughing the passer call on fourth-and-goal gave the Golden Eagles new life.

Napoleon's first score came on a 12-play, 66-yard drive in the first quarter with Mason Roth scoring from a yard out. Passes to Roth and Jester for first downs earlier in that drive set up the score.
