CASCADES CONFERENCE FOOTBALL RECAPS

READING 26, GRASS LAKE 14

Junior Tayshawn Bester added to his interception magic against the Grass Lake Warriors. Bester scored the first two touchdowns of the game for the Rangers on pick 6's, making three against the Warriors in the past two seasons. The two touchdown swing in the second quarter helped re-ignite the Rangers after leaving the first quarter down 0-7. In addition to his defensive success, Bester gave the Rangers 132 yards of offense on the ground. The Rangers found pay dirt two more times in the fourth quarter to defeat the Warriors.

The Rangers were unable to get their passing game off the ground, relying on 307 yards of rushing to carry their offense. Maverick Messenger had 20 carries for 116 yards. Lukas Strine had 11 carries for 59 yards and one touchdown. Jacob Hamilton scored a touchdown and had an interception on defense.

The Warriors opened the scoring with a 55-yard screen pass to Andrew Stockton before the Ranger took a 12-7 lead on a pair of interceptions returned for scores. A four-yard touchdown run by Stockton put Grass Lake back in front in the third quarter, but Reading scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth.

Brayden Lape was 15-for-17 passing for 206 yards for Grass Lake. Jack Pine made 12 tackles and had an interception. Jack Riede added an interception. Stockton had 55 rushing yards and 55 receiving yards.

MANCHESTER 29, ADDISON 26

MANCHESTER -- Facing a fourth-and-inches with 16 seconds left at the Manchester two in Thursday's Week 2 Cascades Conference battle, Addison turned to traditional Addison football trying to power the ball up the middle.

Manchester's defense stopped the play right at the first-down marker, leading to a tense moment as the chain gain came out to measure. The sticks showed the ball just inches short, preserving a 29-26 win over the Panthers for the Flying Dutchmen.

"That's the whole ballgame," Manchester coach Ben Pack said. "That's an elite offense. What they do with running the ball off tackle is the best in the state, all classes. Our kids came up big. We knew coming in we had to get at least one turnover or stop per half. Obviously coming up in the last part of the game is huge. Our kids kept their composure and never died down, just kept playing harder."

Manchester (2-0, 1-0 Cascades) trailed most of the way before putting together an 18-play, 82-yard drive to take the lead with 4:28 left in the game. That drive, burning nine minutes off

the clock ended when Kannon Duffing found Jaxon McGuigan just short of the goalline, and McGuigan powered his way into the end zone.

"A couple plays before we tried running it but didn't get the look we wanted," McGuigan said. "Our coaches, they're good, they fixed what was wrong. We knew on that play if Jeff [Loomis] goes inside and takes that outside linebacker, that it's one-on-one. I caught the ball about half yard short and just kept my legs moving."

That drive saw Manchester convert three third-down chances and a fourth down. The fourth-down conversion came at the four-yard line as Duffing found Luke Blumenauer.

"I had to keep my composure, stay calm, trust that it'll happen," Duffing said.

Addison (1-1, 0-1 Cascades) had a golden chance to answer after the touchdown, getting the ball at its own 24. Turning away for a moment from its traditional running style, Addison gained 50 yards on a pass from Jaxen Sword to Gunnar Demeuse, Sword's only attempted pass of the night.

A pair of Spencer Brown runs then got the ball to the Manchester 11 with just over two minutes to play, but the Flying Dutchmen defense held from there.

"It was great resilience by our guys," Addison coach Joshua Lindeman said. "We couldn't get off the field defensively. Congratulations to Coach Pack. They're moving in the right direction and he's done a really good job over there. It felt a lot tonight like Manchester football was back.

"When we gave up the lead but then got the ball down to the one-yard line, Sword made a great pass to Gunnar and I thought we could punch it in. I usually like our chances if you told me we had the ball at the 11 with two minutes to go, I like my chances against just about anybody. Kudos to them for making the stop at the end."

Long drives helped Addison starve the Manchester offense of chances in the first half. Brown capped off a game-opening 65-yard scoring drive with a 27-yard touchdown, hitting the center of the line initially before bouncing out to his left and finding open territory for the score.

Addison had a two-play drive with Keelan Mullin scoring from 54 yards out, but then with a clock-chewing 11-play scoring drive capped off by a four-yard Joe Clark score. With just over two minutes left in the half, Addison had run 31 offensive plays to Manchester's 11.

The Flying Dutchmen pieced together a picture-perfect two-minute drill, with Duffing hitting McGuigan and Andrew Campbell, then

scrambling for a first down to the Addison 23. After another completion to McGuigan, Duffing hit Campbell on a fade into the left corner of the end zone for a touchdown with 42 seconds left in the half to cut Addison's lead to 20-14.

"It was either a shot or I throw it out of bounds," Duffing said. "It was a chance, and it went our way."

But Addison put together a lightning-quick drive of its own. Despite a muffed ball on the kick return putting the Panthers back at their own 10 to start, Addison went 90 yards in three plays, with Brown scoring on a 55-yard run as time expired.

Manchester also got a first-half score on an 11-yard Blake Sloan run to cap off the opening drive, which went 78 yards in seven plays.

"It was more they were going to get the ball [to start the second half]," Lindeman said. "If we were going to get the ball to start the second half, I probably would have just let it go to the second half. I didn't want to give a possession away knowing they had just scored."

Manchester opened the second half with the ball and went 59 yards in eight plays with a Duffing-to-McGuigan score from 16 yards out to make it Addison 26, Manchester 22 with just over eight minutes to go in the third.

Manchester's defense then stopped Addison on another fourth-down try at the Flying Dutchmen 18, stopping an 11-play drive without a point going onto the scoreboard.

After dominating time of possession in the first half, Addison had two drives in the second half, running 19 offensive plays, and scoring no points.

Duffing finished the game 17-for-21 passing for 226 yards and three touchdowns. McGuigan was on the receiving end of nine passes for 136 yards and two scores.

"We learned last year, a lot of tough games and it came down to the end and we didn't come through," McGuigan said. "It was about battling adversity. That's what we talked about at halftime. They were up two scores and had two more possessions than us. They started with the ball, got the onside, we just had to battle through adversity."

Addison had 18 carries for 177 yards from Brown and 14 carries for 136 from Mullin. As a team, Addison ran 53 rushing plays for 380 yards, with 307 of those yards coming in the first half.

NAPOLEON 41, EAST JACKSON 12

The Napoleon defense recorded seven sacks in a win over the Trojans.

Aiden Nugent had two sacks. Mason Roth,
